III. THE LABOR AND SUFFERING OF THE PROPHET BEFORE AND AFTER THE CONQUEST AND DESTRUCTION OF JERUSALEM

(ch. 34-45).

- A. PROPHECIES DELIVERED UNDER ZEDEKIAH, AND EVENTS OF JEHOIAKIM'S TIME – OBEDIENCE vs. DISOBEDIENCE (ch. 34-36).
1. Concerning Zedekiah and the emancipation of the men-servants and maid-servants, - shameful breach of a solemn covenant (ch. 34).
 - a. Message to Zedekiah: the fruitlessness of resistance to the Chaldeans' power (vs. 1-7).
 - b. The occasion of the message: re-enslavement of Hebrew servants (vs. 8-11).
 - c. The dreadful consequences of the breach of their covenant (vs. 12-22).
 2. The examp of the Rechabites (ch. 35).
 - a. Faithfulness of the Rechabites to the command of their father (ch. 1-11).
 - b. The application to the Jews (vs. 12-15).
 - c. Punishment of the Jews and reward of Rechabites (vs. 16-19).
 3. The writing, reading, and burning of the scroll of Jeremiah's discourses (ch. 36).
 - a. The writing of the roll at the word of Jehovah (vs. 1-8).
 - b. The reading of the book in the temple (vs. 9-19).

- B. LAST DAYS OF JERUSALEM – EXPERIENCES AND UTTERANCES OF JEREMIAH DURING THE SIEGE AND CAPTURE OF THE CITY (ch. 37-39).
1. Jeremiah's warning Zedekiah, his arrest imprisonment (ch. 37-38).
 - a. The siege of Jerusalem and Jeremiah's word to Zedekiah (vs. 1-10).
 - b. The imprisonment of Jeremiah (vs. 11-15).
 - c. Zedekiah's secret interview with Jeremiah; a change of prison (vs. 16-21).
 - d. Jeremiah accused of treason, cast into a miry pit; but rescued by Ebed-melech, the Ethiopian (38:1-13).
 - e. Zedekiah's last consultation with Jeremiah (38:14-28).
 2. Capture of Jerusalem – Fate of Zedekiah and Jeremiah (ch. 39).
 - a. The fall of the city; Jeremiah's prophecies fulfilled (vs. 1-14).
 - b. Jeremiah's message of comfort to Ebed-melech (vs. 15-18).
- C. PREDICTIONS AND EXPERIENCES OF JEREMIAH AFTER THE DESTRUCTION OF JERUSALEM (ch. 40-45).
1. Jeremiah freed. Murder of Gedaliah by Ishmael, and its result (ch. 40-41).
 - a. Liberation of Jeremiah by Nebuzaradan (40:1-6).
 - b. The return of the dispersed: they gather around Gedaliah (vs. 7-12).
 - c. Gedaliah forewarned of Ishmael's intent to murder him (vs. 13-16).
 - d. Murder of Gedaliah and others by Ishmael (41:1-10).
 - e. Struggle against Ishmael; intended flight to Egypt (vs. 11-18).
 2. The word of God concerning the flight to Egypt (ch. 42).

- a. The people's request the Jeremiah pray for them (**vs. 1-6**).
- b. The word of the Lord: Jehovah's reply (**vs. 7-22**).
3. The flight to Egypt – the conquest of Egypt predicted (**ch. 43**).
 - a. The flight of the people to Egypt (**vs. 1-7**).
 - b. Prediction regarding Egypt (**vs. 8-13**).
4. Warning against idolatry, and intimation of its punishment (**ch. 44**).
 - a. The warning and threatening (**vs. 1-14**).
 - b. The answer of the people to this threatening address (**vs. 15-19**).
 - c. Jeremiah's refutation (**vs. 20-23**)
 - d. Announcement of the punishment for this idolatry (**vs. 24-30**).
